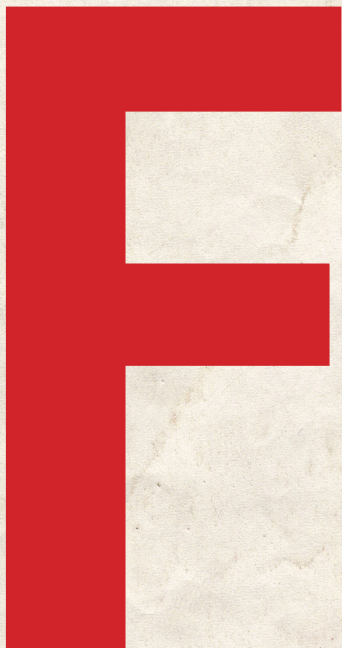

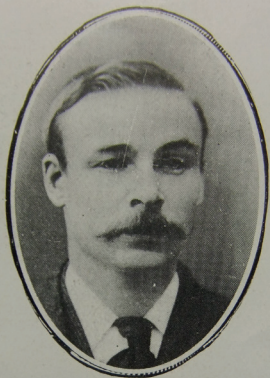
CAPT. J. C. M. FERGUSON

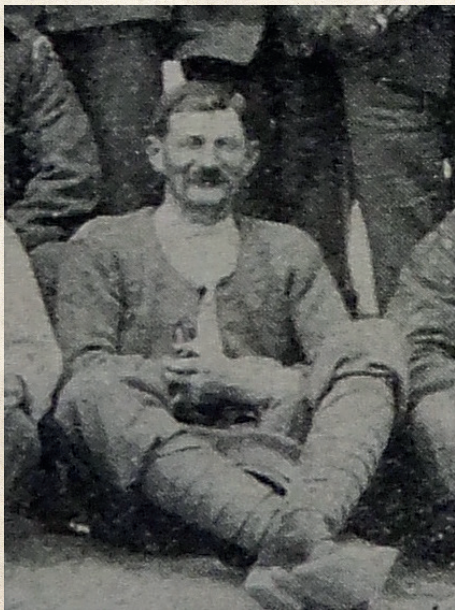

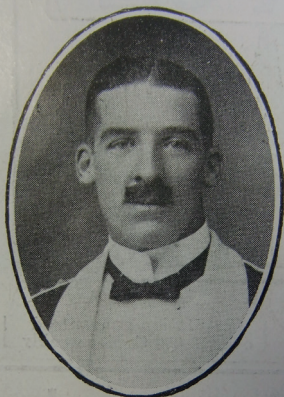

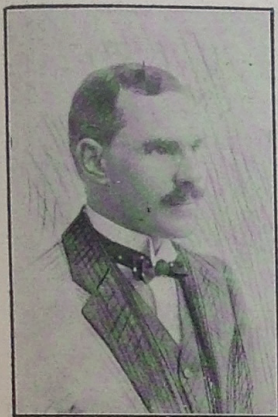
