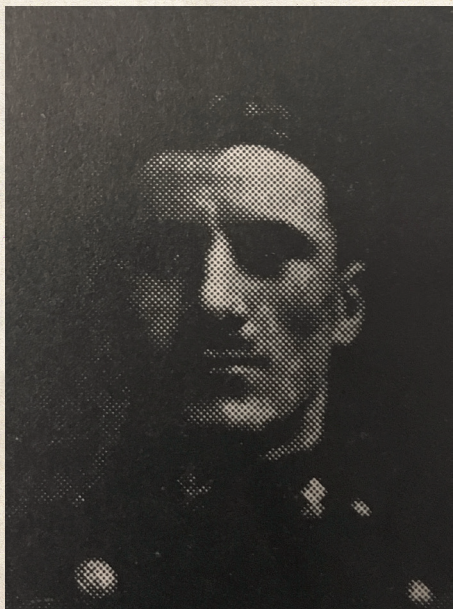

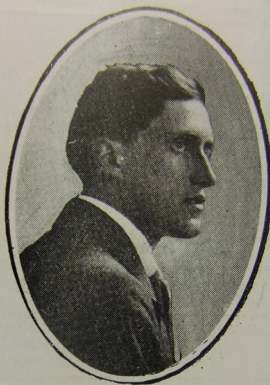


L.-CPL. ALBERT H. GARDNER.

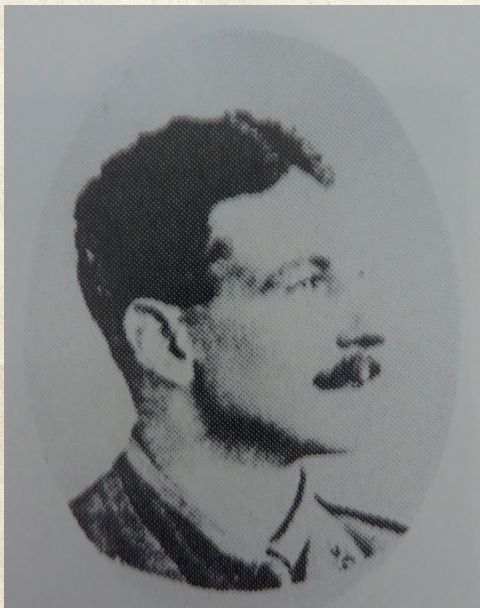

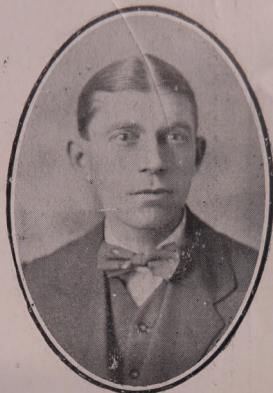

the Postal Service.

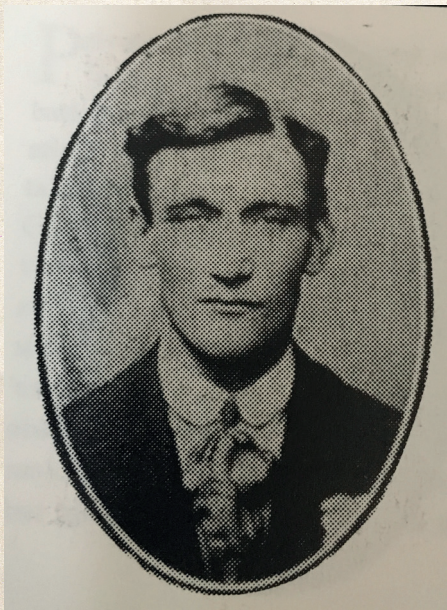

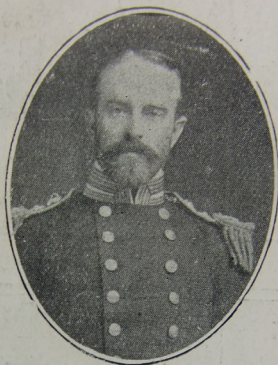
