dren.

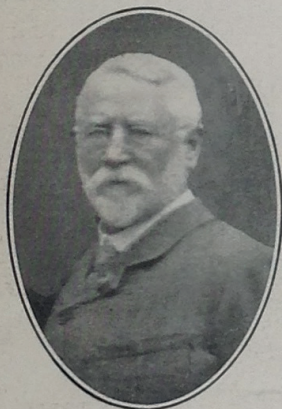
