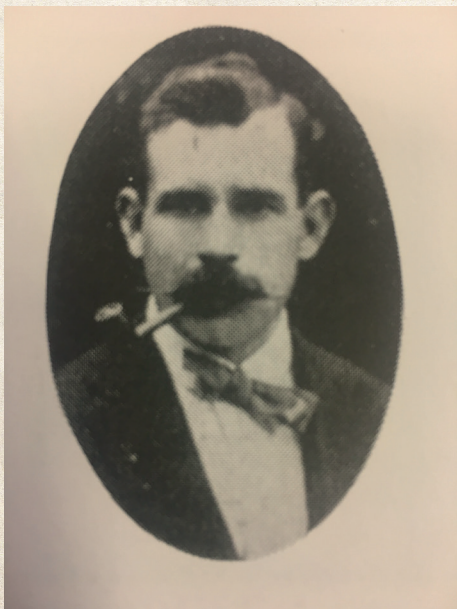


PTE. F. TIDY,

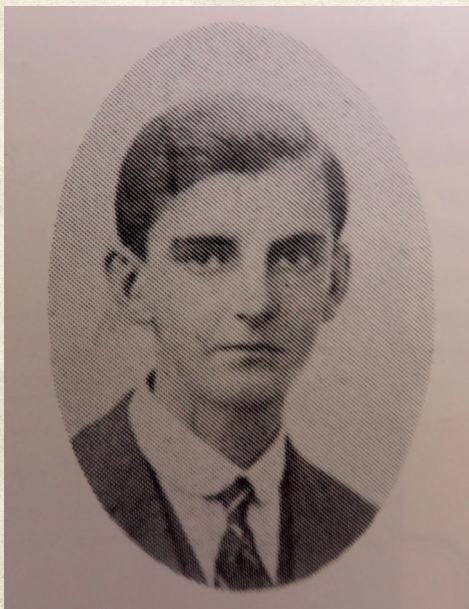

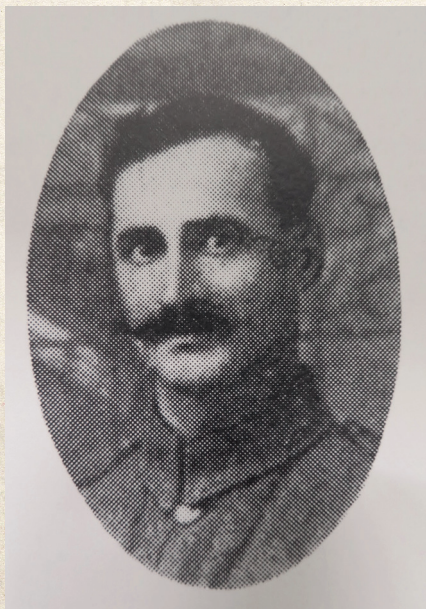

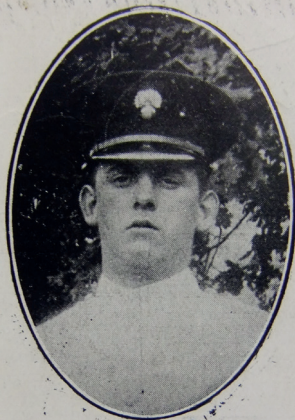
